ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

Adjunct faculty academic position teaching a course in the new **Doctor of Behavioral Health (DBH)** degree program in the School of Letters and Sciences. The DBH is an innovative new doctoral degree program designed to prepare masters degree, licensed behavioral clinicians for an upgrade to a doctoral degree focused on integrated behavioral care. The DBH program is designed to prepare the practitioner to function as a behavioral primary provider on an interdisciplinary medical team in all kinds of healthcare settings as we enter the new era in which behavioral health will be an integral and integrated part of the nation's healthcare system.

This posting is for the courses in **Healthcare Systems: Organization, Delivery and Economics (fall 2009)** and **The Behavioral Health Business Entrepreneur (spring 2010)**. The **Healthcare Systems** course will cover the United States system of hospitals, primary, and ambulatory care. Mental health and substance abuse. Health-care workforce. Public health and the role of government in health care. Managed care. Health-care economics and finance. Market forces in health care. The health-care crisis and health-care reform. The **Behavioral Health Business Entrepreneur** course will cover Management principles, business strategy. Writing and presenting a business plan. Basic accounting and finance. Business law and government regulation. Venture capital and investment. Small business start-up. Contracting. The health-care business case: establishing baseline utilization/costs, intervention costs, projected savings and return on investment/medical cost offset.

The DBH program courses are hybrid residential and distance learning. The faculty will be responsible for preparing and delivering a lecture and supporting materials (slides, notes, assignments). The lecture will be recorded and viewed offline by distance students. The adjunct faculty will use Blackboard, OneNote and related ASU distance learning software. Responsibilities include course advising for students, writes and grades exams, papers, and problem assignments as needed by the course; Assists in reviewing and evaluating effectiveness of teaching methods and work activities; Maintains student grade records for assigned courses.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED

Advanced degree in the field of business or healthcare. Demonstrated teaching experience that emphasizes student success. Demonstrated two or more years of teaching experience at graduate level.

DESIRED

Experience working in business departments or as business consultant in healthcare settings. Demonstrated knowledge of course management systems such as Blackboard; Demonstrated experience using web-based online homework systems; Demonstrated experience working with diverse students. Demonstrated experience working in collaborative environments within and across disciplines.
